Welcome!

Thank you for your interest in the Book Discussion Scheme (BDS). If you are thinking about starting or joining an Intermediate English Book Group, we hope this catalogue gets you excited about reading, meeting new people, and improving your English.

An Intermediate English or ESOL book group is a great way to practise reading, comprehension, and speaking aloud in English. We encourage more than one fluent speaker to be involved in running a group (especially migrant and ESOL groups), so they can contribute to the conversations, share their perspective and/or answer questions about life in New Zealand.

About BDS

The Book Discussion Scheme is a non-profit organisation. We are the only nationwide organisation in New Zealand that specialises in book groups/clubs. We were established in 1973.

How it works

We lend books and discussion notes to book clubs. The books listed in this catalogue are suitable for people who want to read shorter and easier-to-read books in English. The reading level of each book is listed.

Each month we supply groups with a title of their choice from this catalogue. We also send out a set of questions to help start conversation. Everyone in a group gets a copy of the same book and a set of questions. Members have one month to read each book before meeting to discuss it and receive their next book.

Programme costs

The cost of an Intermediate English membership is \$15 per person. This includes:

- 10 sets of books and questions (one book per month for 10 months, excluding Dec/Jan)
- Delivery anywhere in New Zealand

Return postage is the responsibility of the group. We sell subsidised track and trace courier bags for this purpose. Contact bds@bds.org.nz to order.

Membership is to be paid in full when you register your group. If additional members join your group during the year, they pay \$1.50 for each book you have yet to read.

Volunteer convenors/organisers do not need to pay the membership fee.

How to start

A group can start at any time of the year, but the BDS office closes for Christmas/New Year.

- Gather up to 12 members for your group. There is no minimum. You can advertise for more members on the BDS website's interactive map at www.bds.org.nz/join
- Complete and return the Intermediate English/ESOL registration form included in this pack, or request one by emailing bds@bds.org.nz. Full payment is required upon registration.

Helpful info...

Care of books

Book groups are responsible for the care and security of books and questions while on loan from the BDS. Please keep books clean, dry and free of damage.

The group convenor/organiser is responsible for contacting BDS, handing out the books, and returning books to BDS on time.

Keeping track of books

On the back of each book in the scheme is a sticker with a unique barcode. To keep track of who has what book, we suggest each person's name is written beside the relevant barcode number on the consignment note that will arrive with each book parcel.

Loan period

Groups meet on a regular day each month, for example, the second Wednesday of the month. Books are due back to the BDS office within 7 days of the meeting when you discussed the book. This due date is printed on the consignment note.

Lee, Maureen 112pp 2012




Rabley, Stephen 16pp 2008

BOYNE, JOHN 69pp 2020

One day, Bruno's father gets a new job, and the family have to move from Berlin, Germany, to a new place. There is a strange camp at the end of the garden. Bruno is very unhappy and bored until he meets Shmuel. The two boys become very good friends. But why is Schmuel in the camp? And why is he wearing striped pyjamas? (Level 4 English)



CANTERBURY QUAKE

Wallace, Desna 173pp 2014

A vividly imaged account of the 2010 and 2011 Canterbury earthquakes, told through the diary entries of 11-year-old Maddy. As Maddy struggles with the effects the earthquakes have on her life, she begins to discover the importance of family and friendship, especially when your world gets turned upside down. (Level 4 English)

Moss, Kate 97pp 2009

A gripping adventure set in France in the 1920s. It's ten years since the end of World War I and Freddie hasn't recovered from the loss of his brother. On holiday he has a car crash and ends up in a village where he meets Marie. Her story will lead him to some caves above the village — and to the heart of a shocking secret. (Quick Reads publication, approx Level 4 English)

CELLIST OF SARAJEVO, THE

Galloway, Steven 112pp 2006

Sarajevo is under siege. There is little food or water and the city is attacked, every day, from the hills. Ordinary people try to live their lives, but they are losing hope for the future. Then, one day, a musician picks up his instrument. Four people whose lives have been upended are ultimately reminded of what it is to be human. A powerful novel inspired by a true story. (Level 3 English)

Mark Sway is eleven and knows a terrible secret. He knows where a body is hidden. Some secrets are so dangerous that it's better not to tell. But it's just as dangerous if you don't. So Mark needs help fast... because there isn't much time. (Level 4 English)

There he meets a man who tells him about treasure on the island of Monte Cristo. Will he escape from prison? Will he find treasure? (Level 3 English)

During a summer holiday, Danny Delaney's mum hits a small boy with her car. It's not certain the boy will wake from his coma. DARLING BUDS OF MAY, THE

Bates, H.E. 48pp 2008

Meet the Larkin family! They enjoy a wonderful country life, never worrying about money, work — or the law. But then, one day, a man arrives from the tax office. Is he going to change the Larkins' lives? Or is his life going to change for ever? Also made into a TV series. (Level 3 English)

Anne Frank is a youg Dutch teenager who, along with her family, go into hiding during World War II. This story is based on her real-life diary about their experiences of living secretly in the annexe of her father's office. Life is dangerous and they hope for the best — but are finally discovered and captured. (Level 4 English)

When Private Investigator, Gulliver Dowd, discovers that his new client is his old sweetheart from high school he initially wants to refuse the case. The life story and family history of Adeline Yen Mah, who was born in China during a time of great change. At the same time, she suffered terrible unkindness from the members of her own family. A story of pain and fear, but also of hope as Adeline fights for her independence. (Level 4 English)


Albom, Mitch 98pp 2014

When Eddie dies trying to save a child from a terrible accident, he wakes up in heaven. Heaven, he discovers, is a place where your life on earth is finally explained to you. It is explained by five people, friends or strangers, who somehow affected your life — and who changed its path forever. This story, which has been translated into more than 40 languages, advocates the value of love and human life. (Level 5 English)

FOOD FOR THOUGHT

Francis, Pauline 38pp 2004

When Joe's uncle breaks his wrist, he asks Joe to help out on his farm in Cornwall, England, during the summer holidays. Joe finds himself in the middle of a disagreement about GM (genetically modified) crop trials. He also meets two very different girls — but what do they really want from him? (Level 3 English)



FORREST GUMP

Groom, Winston 41pp 2008

The 1994 film version of this story won six Oscars, including the Best Actor award for Tom Hanks. Slowwitted Forrest Gump is told by everyone that he's an idiot. Yet he has all sorts of adventures and inspires people with his childlike optimism. But can he ever marry the girl he loves? His journey through life is sometimes very funny and sometimes sad. (Level 3 English)

FOUR WARNED F, TS, L

Archer, Jeffrey 98pp 2014

A collection of four short stories from a master storyteller and bestselling author. Jeremy finds out exactly how to steal the perfect engagement ring for his fiancee; Albert gets a telegram from the Queen of England for his 100th birthday; Richard plans to murder his wife in a hotel room; and Diana is being followed on the motorway by a black van. (Quick Reads publication, approx Level 4)

Curtis, Richard 68pp 2013

A humourous story about a man who attends all of his friends' weddings and wonders if he will ever get married himself — and then he meets Carrie...A pleasurable read. Upper-Intermediate reading level. (Level 5 English)



On the surface, Claire Saunders has it all. She has a rewarding career in fashion and a talented concert pianist daughter. Her loving husband is one of the country's most trusted diplomats. But every now and again, she has to plaster her face in heavy make-up and wear sunglasses. She thinks she's hidden her secret from her best friends, but they know her too well. Is she hiding something? Is she more dangerous than the President's enemies?[Reference to violence] (Level 3 English).

Learn about some of the most interesting and important inventions from 2,500 years ago to the present day. Arranged in nine chapters, the book covers inventions such as computers, engines, mathematics, guns and printing. (Level 4 English)

Her movies are on TV. Her music is on the radio. Jennifer Lopez is a Hollywood star and a successful singer. She is a Latin performer and "Latin" is all about colour, fun and life! And who is the number one Latina? Jennifer, of course. (Level 1 English)

KALAHARI TYPING SCHOOL FOR MEN, THE

McCall Smith, Alexander 70pp 2009

When a new detective agency opens in town, Precious Ramotswe has an unexpected problem: competition! At the same time, her assistant Mma Makutsi has problems of her own. As always, solutions can be found at Botswana's No. 1 Ladies' Dectective Agency, thanks to the sensible Mma Ramotswe and plenty of red bush tea. (Level 4 English)



KAREN AND THE ARTIST

Laird, Elizabeth 16pp 2008

Karen's job takes her to many places. She loves art, and in Rome she meets a young artist who paints beautiful pictures — but he is unable to sell them and has no money. Karen likes the young man. Can she sell his pictures for him? (Level 1 English)

KIDNAPPED

Stevenson, Robert Louis 37pp 2000

After his parents die young, David Balfour goes to live with his old uncle, Ebenezer, who sends the young lad to America on a sailing boat. Who is the stranger on the ship? Can he help David? Set in the mid-18th century, when the King of England is under threat, this is a classic tale by a well-known 19th century Scottish novelist. (Level 2 English)

LAST KING OF SCOTLAND, THE

Foden, Giles 49pp 2012

In the early 1970s, a young Scottish doctor Nicholas Garrigan goes to Uganda to work in a clinic. When a car accident happens near the clinic, he goes to assist. The injured man is none other than the President of Uganda, Idi Amin — one of the most dangerous and hated men in the world. Garrigan's life will never be the same. A fictionalised account set during a tumultuous time in the country's history. [Contains some graphic content]. (Level 3 English)


LIFE OF PI

Martel, Yann 57pp 2001

After deciding to sell their zoo in India and move to Canada, Santosh and Gita Patel board a freighter with their sons and a few remaining animals. Tragedy strikes when a terrible storm sinks the ship, leaving the Patels' teenage son, Pi, as the only human survivor. However, Pi is not alone; a fearsome Bengal tiger has also found refuge aboard the lifeboat. As days turn into weeks and weeks drag into months, Pi and the tiger must learn to trust each other if both are to survive. Made into a film. (Scholastic Level 3 English)



LOVE ACTUALLY

Curtis, Richard 53pp 2004

Also a comedy film, this story — set in London, with Christmas approaching — is about people with love on their minds. Some have found it, some have lost it. Some accept their loneliness; others live in hope. Even the British Prime Minister's thoughts are not always on the job because love, actually, is all around us. (Level 4 English)

LUCKY BREAK

Escott, John 15pp 2008

Tom breaks his leg in a football game — it's not his lucky day! A week later, he sees his favourite movie star. But Tom falls again — and suddenly the movie star does too. Reporters are taking photos. Is this Tom's lucky break? (Easystart/pre-Level 1 English)

MADAME DOUBTFIRE

Fine, Anne 38pp 1995

Known as Mrs Doubtfire in the film version (played by comedian Robin Williams), this story is about a family whose parents separate. The husband would like to see more of his children, but they live with their mother. Then Madame Doubtfire comes to work for Miranda and look after the children. However, Madame Doubtfire seems strange; more like a man than a woman...(Level 3 English)

MALALA

NF

Beddall, Fiona 40pp 2015

On October 9, 2012, 15-year-old Malala Yousafzai was shot in the head on the school bus by the Taliban, an islamic fundamentalist group waging war in her country. Malala believed that all girls have a right to an education and the Taliban wanted to stop her campaign — but Malala didn't die. Today she is the youngest person with a Nobel Peace Prize and continues to campaign for girls' education around the world. This is the true story of a girl who wanted to change the world — and did. (Scholastic Level 1 English)




MARLEY & ME

Grogan, John 38pp 2012

Made into a movie, this story is about a puppy called Marley who gets bigger and bigger, more clumsy, doesn't listen to his owners and eats everything in sight. But he loves his owners and they love him. Surely he can't be the world's worst dog? (Level 2 English)



MARTIN LUTHER KING

Degnan-Veness, Coleen 41pp 2008

Martin Luther King led the African-American Civil Rights Movement during the 1950s and 60s — a time when all men were not equal. He is best known for advancing civil rights using nonviolent civil disobedience based on his Christian beliefs. But has King's dream of equality for African-Americans come true today? (Level 3 English)

MASK OF ZORRO, THE

Rollason, Jane 56pp 2010

For 20 years, Zorro, the people's fighter, has been in California's worst prison. The villian, Rafael Montero, put him there. Now Montero is back in California and Zorro wants to fight for his people again, but he is an old man now — can he find a new Zorro? Based on the screenplay by John Eskow, Ted Elliot and Terry Rossio. (Scholastic Level 2 English)

MIEKO AND THE FIFTH TREASURE

Coerr, Eleanor 77pp 1993

When the bomb was dropped on Nagasaki, Mieko's nearby village was turned to ruins. She and her parents were lucky to have survived, but Meiko's hand was badly injured. Mieko loves to do calligraphy more than anything, but now she can barely hold a paintbrush. She feels as if she has lost something she can't paint without — the legendary fifth treasure, beauty in the heart. Can she find it again? (Puffin book, approx Level 4 English)



MOTHER TERESA

D'Arcy Adrian-Vallance 16pp 2006

Mother Teresa is a Nobel Prize winner and is probably the best known nun in the world. She helped poor people on the streets of India and became very famous for her work. She died in 1997, but people around the world still remember her today. This is her story. (Level 1 English)

MUHAMMAD ALI

Smith, Bernard 14pp 2008

Born in 1942, Cassius Marcellus Clay Jr went on to be one of the most significant and celebrated sports figures of the 20th century. After becoming an American professional boxer, Muhammad later became an activist. But why did a young boy from Kentucky start to box in the first place and how did it shape the rest of his life? (Level 1 English)

NEW ZEALAND ADVENTURE, A

Thorburn, Jan 15pp 2008

Sarah and Jessica arrive in New Zealand for a holiday. They find a mobile phone in the taxi from the airport. It's Michael's mobile, but they can't find him. He has messages from home — are they important? Go with the girls on an adventure around New Zealand to return Michael's phone. (Easystart/pre-Level 1 English)



NIGHT AT THE MUSEUM

Edwards, Lynda 31pp 2008

Larry Daley is very happy about his new job at the Museum of Natural History, but on his first night something very exciting happens. Everything in the Museum comes alive! The old night guards didn't tell him this — and they didn't tell him the secret of the Tablet of Ahkmenrah. Can Larry find out the secret? And can he keep his job at the museum? Based on the screen story & screenplay by Robert Ben Garant & Thomas Lennon. (Scholastic Level 1 English)

NOTTING HILL

Curtis, Richard 59pp 2008

A leading American actress accidentally meets an attractive, but unassuming British travel book seller and love immediately blossoms. However, fame and her American actor boyfriend get in the way. This book is adapted from the 1999 film script by Richard Curtis. (Level 3 English)

OLIVER TWIST

Dickens, Charles 47pp 2011

The classic tale of a poor orphan boy who runs away from an abusive master, only to fall in with thieves and robbers on the cruel streets of 19th-century London. Eventually Oliver discovers the truth about his past, and finds a true home. Adapted from the original novel by Charles Dickens. (Level 3 English)

PEARL GIRL, THE

Rabley, Stephen 14pp 2008

A story about a Canadian girl who goes to Europe and sees the 17th-century Dutch painting Girl with the Pearl Earring. While in the museum, Kate Grant intercepts two burglars. What will happen? (Easystart/pre-Level 1 English)

PERFECT HOLIDAY, THE

Kelly, Cathy 87pp 2010

A light, easy read about three different sets of people (two friends, a couple, and a recently widowed woman) who go to a Greek island to discover the truth about love and find their 'happy ending'. (Quick Reads publication, approx Level 3 English)



PROJECT OMEGA

O'Reilly, Elaine 27pp 2008

Charles Hadfield Baker III, one of the richest people in New York, suddenly disappears. His daughter, Julia, wants to find him. The directors of his company want power and money. Do they know where he is? And what is Project Omega? Can Julia find her father and save his company? (Level 2 English)

Iggulden, Conn 74pp 2012






